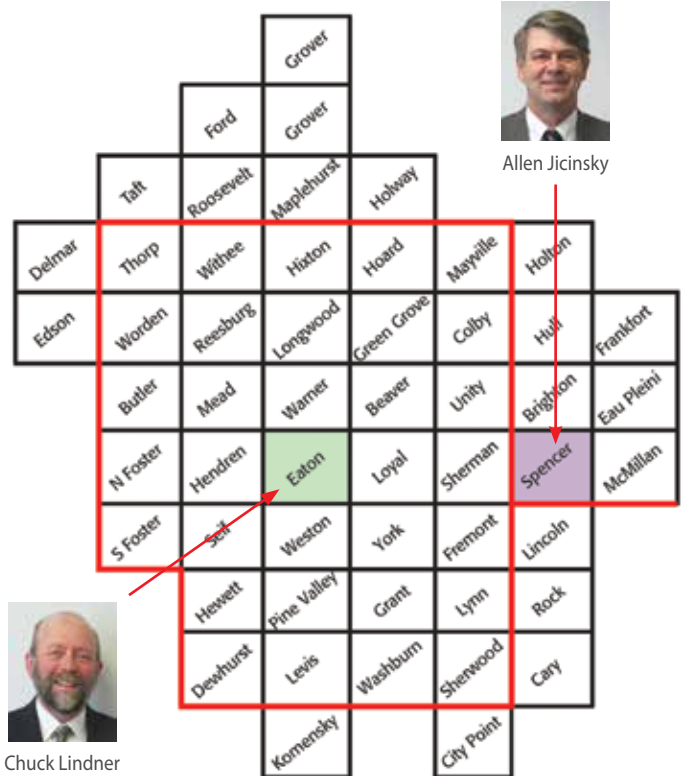
The members will be asked to elect two directors, for three-year terms. Directors whose terms are expiring this year are Chuck Lindner from the Town of Eaton and Allen Jicinsky from the Town of Spencer. Lindner and Jicinsky are eligible for re-election. Nominations for the director positions are taken from the floor of the meeting. Any member advisory resolutions must be received by the cooperative at least 15 days before the date of the annual meeting.

The cooperative's bylaws establish the minimum qualifications for being a director. If you have any additional questions about becoming a director, please contact Tim Stewart, CEO/GM, at the business office.

Directors are expected to attend monthly board meetings; represent the cooperative in state, regional, and national affairs; and take advantage of NRECA educational opportunities such as classes, seminars, and workshops. Directors need to read, study, and analyze a lot of information throughout the month to keep informed on the electric industry as a whole. Directors will spend approximately 20 to 35 days a

year in performance of their duties.

Plan to attend the annual meeting, enjoy a nice meal, register for door prizes, and help conduct the business of your electric utility. Member involvement is critically important to the success of your cooperative.

## ADLER-CLARK ELECTRIC FOUNDATION AWARDS \$38,300

Over \$500,000 distributed to community projects since foundation's inception

The Adler-Clark Electric Community Commitment Foundation recently awarded \$38,300 to 24 different community-based projects located throughout the Clark Electric Cooperative service area.

Tim Stewart, chief executive officer of Clark Electric Cooperative and one of the trustees of the Adler-Clark Electric Community Commitment Foundation, indicated that "The purpose

of the ACE-Community Commitment Foundation is to support programs and events that enrich the lives of people of Clark County and the surrounding area communities. Our mission is to invest in the future of the Clark County area by helping create opportunity for philanthropy and community enrichment. We are pleased to be a part of these community enrichment programs."

The ACE-Community Commitment Foundation was established in 2004 by Clark Electric Appliance and Satellite, Inc., to strengthen local communities by aiding not-for-profit and community organizations fund projects that will enhance the quality of life of local residents of this area. To date, the Foundation has awarded \$500,910 for community enrichment projects.



## LINDA MCALEY TO RETIRE AFTER 45 YEARS

### “Where has the time gone?”



Where has the time gone? As much as Tim Stewart, our CEO, would like you to think, NO, we did not use the abacas back when I started with Clark Electric Cooperative, but we have seen a tremendous amount of change over the years that has touched just about all aspects of our business. I began my career in 1973 when I was hired by Dick Adler as an office clerk. Back then the price of a kilowatt hour was just under 2.50 cents, with the average monthly member bill at just \$27.73. The cooperative’s total assets were just over \$6 million. Today the price of a kilowatt hour is 11.80 cents, with the average monthly bill at \$204. Total assets are now over \$53 million. Not only have our members doubled since 1973, but kWh sales have increased 250 percent as people require more and more energy.

Operationally, we have also seen a wide range of improvements. Long gone are the days of our members self-reading the meters and writing their meter reading on the “stub” portion of their billings and returning readings back to our office. I never dreamed I would see the day our meters would be “sending in” readings. Clark Electric Cooperative will be embarking on the third different Automated Meter Reading (AMR) system. Clark first utilized a partial AMR system for our Time of Day meters—the AIM system. This system used the telephone line to “call in” the daily meter reading. With the ease and convenience of cell phones, members were starting to take out their land lines, making this type of system obsolete for our portion of meters that were using this AMR system.

In 2004, Clark implemented our TS2 AMR system. This system utilized our power lines to bring in daily readings. This system has worked really well but due to manufacturer obsolescence must be replaced. Our TS2 system is scheduled

to be replaced by the AMR system by Eaton, which uses repeaters and relays to capture readings.

In the same aspect, we have seen billing systems evolve from a single sheet of 14X24 construction-weight paper, with magnetic stripes on the back of the right-hand side, and printing of “stored information” on the front of this sheet for each meter on Clark’s system. The process of calculating billing could take up to seven days. Now calculating bills can be accomplished in about 30 minutes. The list of changes through the years is endless.

On a serious note, it has been a great privilege to help guide/bring our great cooperative through these different phases of technologies and processes. Thank you to past and present board of directors and CEO/GMs who have led and continue to lead our cooperative through challenges and difficult times. I truly believe that keeping the seven cooperative principles in sight at all times will continue to make Clark Electric an outstanding cooperative of and for our members.

Traveling plans are in my future. There is so much of our great state and country that I need to explore and see. I’m looking forward to continuing to enjoy time with family and friends, by or on the water, enjoying music concerts, shows, and of course, leaving time for football season.—Linda McAley
